Amateur Status - a person is an Amateur for the purpose of classes run under Society rules if he/she does not, during the current or previous season:

Engage in showing livery/production, buying, selling, dealing or hiring of horses in any commercial capacity, or owning/standing a stallion at stud, teaching or coaching, as means of deriving a source of income.

Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in showing livery/production, teaching or coaching, (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This rule does not include the suppliers of ancillary services in equestrianism, such as farriers, vets, therapists or administrative office roles.

Show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm or show a horse for which his/her immediate family accepts showing livery production or training charges, from a person outside the immediate family concerned, in any showing classes, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise.

Act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise.

A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an exhibit, which has been ridden by a professional rider in ANY class, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise, with the exception of Working and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the following year, up to and including the Royal International Horse Show.

NOTE: Novice horses ridden by a professional before the 1st January 2025, will not be affected by the rule changes, and therefore will be eligible to compete in Amateur classes during the 2025 Show Season.

(The above Rule, 3e(v), does not apply if the horse has been professionally produced and ONLY ridden by a showing professional, during the previous season, or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new ownership).

If you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board/Council, i.e., if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional.

At any time whilst on the showground, where an exhibit is going to be competing in Amateur classes, showing professionals, including professional show grooms, are not allowed to ride, work in (in any form), teach or coach the rider/horse, compete, or enter the ring to groom/strip the horse.

Amateur Owner/Rider classes: Open to horses owned and ridden by an Amateur. No showing professional, including professional show grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the horse, with the exception of Amateur Working Hunter classes where ALL Amateur's including Amateur Home-Produced can receive professional help when walking the course and warming-up in the collecting ring for the jumping phase only – no professional assistance is permitted during the flat ridden /ride section of the class.

Amateur Home-Produced classes: Open to horses, which are either stabled at home or in a D.I.Y. yard, assisted livery permitted, and which since 1st January in the current year, have not been shown by a professional during the current season or stabled in a professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur. This does not exclude Amateur Owner Home Produced riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. No showing professional, including professional show grooms, are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the horse. We may require a statement of your eligibility to compete in Home Produced classes.

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES/CHARGES

All British Competitors please note that all entries must be made online not later than 2nd June 2025 (9th June for showjumping). If entries are cancelled after the closing date, half the entry fee will be refunded on production of a current vet's certificate. We regret no stabling charges can be refunded. Exhibitors will be charged a £3.00 administration fee.

EXHIBITORS PASSES

Showjumping - Owners and riders of horses must be members of Hickstead where applicable, and will receive one Groom's wristband per two horses, plus a Horsebox Pass for parking in the Stable Field. Exhibitors who are competing in a British Showjumping Winter Final only do not need to be members of Hickstead and will receive two members' badges, one for the owner and one for the rider, plus a Horsebox Pass. One Groom's Wristband will be allocated per two horses. Passes will only be issued to exhibitors for the day they are exhibiting.

Showing - Exhibitors in the Showing Classes will receive two members' badges, one for the owner and one for the rider, plus a Horsebox Pass for parking in the Stable Field. One Groom's Wristband will be allocated per two horses.

Please note: Exhibitors' passes are valid the day before their classes when overnight stabling is booked. Access is limited to Stable Field only, and to the showground and Trade Stand Village from 4.00pm. Exhibitors may purchase extra passes in advance from the Hickstead Office. Exhibitor passes will only be issued for the day of competition. Weekly stabling does not entitle exhibitors to a full quota of weekly passes - only one weekly Groom's wristband per two horses will be issued free of charge. Extra passes will need to be purchased.

RIDERS' CAR PARK

Due to lack of space, no cars will be admitted to the Stable Field. Exhibitors and visitors parking in the Riders' Car Park at the top of the Stable Field near the exit will be charged £15 per day or £60 for the week if purchased in advance, or £20 on the day.

SHOWING GROOMS

Grooms must be correctly dressed when entering the arena, i.e., hat and jacket. No denim. Anyone deemed inappropriately dressed will not be allowed to enter the ring.

SHOWING EXHIBITORS NUMBERS AND MARKSHEETS

Showing exhibitors will be sent their numbers in advance with their badges. Official showing mark sheets will not be used in any flat classes, and marks will not be published except in working hunter classes. Regrettably, no copies will be available from the show office.

CHANGE OF RIDER IN SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIPS, FINAL JUDGINGS & OVERALL SUPREMES

No change of rider will be accepted in any of the showing championships, final judgings or overall Supreme Championships without authorisation from the Showing Director.

STABLING

Stabling must be booked online in advance. The final date of application is 2nd June 2025, after which no guarantee will be given that stabling on the showground can be made available. No application for a refund of charges paid can be considered after 2nd June. Stallion owners are required to bring their own electric packs. Unruly or dangerous animals may be asked to leave the showground. Exhibitors are expected to leave their stables in a clean state - failure to do so may result in future expulsion from Hickstead. Due to the escalating cost of muck removal from the site, exhibitors will be charged £6 per stable to go towards the cost of this service.

ARRIVALS & DEPARTURES

Exhibitors arriving for the first time at the Agria Royal International Horse Show will not be admitted between the hours of 10.00pm and 6.00am. No animals or persons may arrive before 10.00am on Monday 21st July. All animals must be removed on Monday 28th July 2025. No horses or ponies may be kept in lorries overnight. Exhibitors who have not booked stabling will not be admitted to the Stable Field until the day of their competition.

OVERNIGHT STABLING INCLUDING CHARGES FOR LATE DEPARTURE/DIRTY STABLES

Daily stabling is bookable for a 23-hour period; from 5.30pm to 4.30pm the next day. Those exhibitors failing to vacate their stables by 4.30pm will be fined £40 per stable. Exhibitors failing to leave stables clean for the next arrival will be charged £30 per stable.

BEDDING AND FORAGE

Please note that due to fire regulations, straw is not permitted in the Stable Field. Stables will not be bedded down in advance. Extra shavings, hay and forage can be purchased in the Stable Field on a daily basis. Deliveries to the Stable Field by alternative suppliers will not be allowed.

ELECTRIC HOOK UP

This must be booked in advance with entries. Due to escalating costs and being unable to use red diesel, the price has risen to £180 for the week.

CARAVANS AND LIVED-IN HORSE BOXES

There will be a limit of one caravan or one lived-in horse box per exhibitor for every three horses which they enter for the show. There will be no charge. Exhibitors with generators on their horseboxes must turn them off by 10.00pm. This ruling will be strictly enforced by Stable Field Security. Exhibitors who fail to comply with this ruling will be asked to leave the showground.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be paid directly by BACS into your nominated bank account post show.

CUPS AND TROPHIES

Exhibitors who win a trophy at the Agria Royal International Horse Show will have their details engraved on the trophy but will not be allowed to take them home. We have had to make this regrettable decision due to escalating insurance costs and carriage charges.

RULES FOR SHOW JUMPING EXHIBITORS

SUBSTITUTIONS AND LATE ENTRIES

Substitutions may be allowed in Jumping Competitions at the discretion of the Executive, providing they conform to Rule 79.4. Late and amended entries, if taken at the show, will be charged an extra £5 per class.

DECLARATIONS

Declarations for all International Classes must be made either by telephone or in person on the previous evening by 5.00pm. Late Declarations (If accepted) will be charged a premium of £25. Competitors in national classes must declare at the ringside before the start of their class. If there are no competitors waiting to jump or there are no numbers on the blackboard, the judges will close the class. This rule particularly applies to the first class of the day. Please ensure that you arrive early.

UNACCOMPANIED COMPETITORS

Unaccompanied competitors must provide the Show Organiser with a contact telephone number in case of an emergency.

READINESS FOR JUMPING

Horses must jump in the order in which they appear on the Notice Board unless special permission has been obtained from the Lead Official. This regulation will be strictly enforced. Any competitor missing his turn may be eliminated from the competition. During the competition three competitors must always be ready to enter the Arena. If a competitor does not respond when he is called, he loses his turn and may be eliminated from the competition in progress.

JUNIOR MEMBERS

Junior Members are only permitted to compete on horses from the calendar year in which the age of 12 is reached.

HEADGEAR

Members of British Showjumping competing in international competitions will be required to wear headgear in accordance with Rule 101.3.

STALLIONS

"Rule 82.19 No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other members of the public are not put at risk of injury". Refer to Rule 102.13.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL RIDERS

A full copy of the approved FEI schedule for the Hickstead CSIO 5*, plus the appendix, is available to download for all competitors from the Hickstead website, www.hickstead.co.uk

CHEFS D'EQUIPE MEETING

The Chefs d'Equipe meeting will take place at 18.00 hours on Wednesday 23rd July 2025.

HORSE INSPECTION

A horse Inspection will be carried out in the International Stable Compound between 14.30 and 17.30 hours on Wednesday 23rd July 2025. All horses taking part at this event must be presented during the first horse inspection, otherwise they are not permitted to participate.

ELIGIBILITY OF NATIONAL COMPETITORS FOR INTERNATIONAL CLASSES

The only National competitors eligible to compete are the following:

- (a) The top 10 British riders on the FEI Longines Ranking List no. 292 (31.04.2025).
- (b) The top 20 riders on the Area/International Points List for the period 1 April 30 September 2024, the first 3 riders in The All England Grand Prix at Hickstead in September 2024 and the holder of the QE II Cup will qualify for The Queen Elizabeth II Cup, plus those selected by the Organising Committee in consultation with the British Team Manager.
- (c) The show reserves the right to invite up to four additional riders to compete at this show.
- (d) Riders qualified under sections (a), and (c) may bring no more than three horses to the show for international jumping classes.
- (e) Riders qualified under section (b) may bring no more than one horse for The Queen Elizabeth II Cup.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION CERTIFICATES

All horses and ponies entering the Showground must be vaccinated according to the following requirements, and vaccination certificates/passports must accompany the horse or pony to the show and be available for checking: Horses/ponies must have received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. Only these two injections need to have been given before a horse/pony can compete in competitions. In addition, a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than one year apart. Horses/ponies must have received the full course of vaccinations or the booster at least 7 days prior to the competition date, and not more than 1 year after the previous booster.

Horses competing in FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with FEI Veterinary Regulations.

There will be no tolerance of Equine Influenza vaccination certificates that do not meet show protocol. If discrepancies are found, this will result in the horse being sent home immediately, without competing and/or any prizes will be forfeited.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. DRESS

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse for any reason.

International Jumping: In accordance with the FEI Rules.

National Jumping Classes: As in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 101.

Showing Classes: In accordance with the rules of the relevant Showing Society. In classes where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the ring during preliminary or final judging, they must be correctly dressed. Headwear, coats, collar and ties must be worn.

2. FORFEITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and all other charges other than in accordance with British Showjumping Rules. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.

3. PRIZE GIVING

Owners of winning horses are most welcome to come into the arena for the prize giving but only if suitably dressed. This applies to all rings.

4. TIMETABLE AND CLASS LISTS

The revised timetable and class lists will be posted online. Riders whose horses are not stabled at Hickstead are strongly advised to check the Hickstead website www.hickstead.co.uk after 8.00pm for revised times.

5. HORSEBOXES

It is a requirement to put your mobile telephone number on your horsebox pass which must be displayed in the windscreen. It is prohibited for any exhibitor or associate to interfere with another exhibitor's horsebox.

6. VEHICLES

The Executives reserves the right to remove any vehicle which is obstructing any access to or from the ground even if locked and unattended and the Executive will not be liable for any injury, loss or damage occasioned by such removal.

7. MOTORBIKES AND BICYCLES

In the interests of safety of competitors and members of the public, the riding of electric scooters, bicycles, motorcycles, mopeds, etc., is FORBIDDEN anywhere on the Hickstead Showground. Anybody contravening this rule will be sent off the Showground.

8. PARTIES & INCONSIDERATE BEHAVIOUR IN THE STABLE FIELD

Whilst we appreciate that our shows and a social scene go hand in hand, the level of respect for other competitors and staff in recent years has been unacceptable. Hickstead has a no noise policy after 2300hrs meaning loud parties and gatherings after this time will not be tolerated. Children should not be allowed to roam free with water pistols, Segways and bikes. The Stable Field is a constant road network with HGVs using it 24/7 – it is not a playground! WH Management has our full authorisation to remove anyone not respecting these rules, forfeiting any remaining entries.

9. FIRE PRECAUTION

The County Fire Officer of West Sussex has ordered that all horseboxes and caravans parked in the Stable Field must carry a fire extinguisher and be fitted with a working smoke alarm. You may be asked to leave if you do not have them.

10. AGE AND HEIGHT

The age and height of each animal entered, and other specified particulars must be accurately stated when entering. Age is in all cases to be computed from the first of January of the year in which the animal was foaled.

Animals exhibited in Classes restricted in height will only be measured on an Objection. However, Joint Measurement Board Height Certificates must be carried by the exhibitor or rider of all animals in the Hack, Cob, Small Hunter, Small Riding Horses and Children's Pony Classes during the Show, and be produced if requested.

A false declaration or misstatement of any kind (including change of name of an animal or incorrect description or false declaration of prizes won at Horse Shows) may at the discretion of the Committee disqualify an Exhibitor from the Show and the animal entered from any prize and from entering or being entered again at the RIHS. In particular a misstatement as to height will automatically render the animal ineligible for any judging or prize. Exhibitors must be prepared to verify any statement in a manner required by the Committee.

11. VETERINARY EXAMINATION

The judges of every class other than the Jumping Classes shall have power to require any animal to be examined for soundness by the Veterinary Surgeon. The results of any veterinary examinations shall be regarded as confidential, and the decision of the Veterinary Surgeons shall be final.

12. DOPE TESTS

BEFAR reserves the right to take random "dope" tests on horses and ponies in any class held at the RIHS. These tests will be carried out in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of BEFAR.

13. JUDGES

The Committee reserves the right to substitute other judges for those names in the Show Schedule or to make additional appointments (applicable only to National classes).

14. PHOTOGRAPHY & FILMING

No professional photography is allowed on the showground except with permission obtained from the Press Office. It is understood and agreed by any competitor attending the show that permission is granted to Hickstead Ltd for any photographs and/or film footage taken at the show by any official photographer or film company to be used by them for security, promotional, live streaming and/or broadcasting purposes, furthermore the competitor agrees that permission is without any payment.

- 15. ANY COMPETITOR found riding in the ring without permission will be disqualified from the show and reported to the Stewards. All warming up must be done in the area provided. No one is allowed on the Showground in the evenings or up to an hour before the first class in the morning. Any person riding their horses anywhere other than in the permitted areas will be subject to disciplinary action by the Ground Jury and may be ordered off the Showground.
- 16. THE EXECUTIVE MAY IN ANY DISPUTE OR OTHER MATTER WHATSOEVER, ACT OR DECIDE IN ANY MANNER THEY THINK FIT (SAVING FEI AND BRITISH SHOWJUMPING RULES). ALL OBJECTIONS AND COMPLAINTS MUST BE MADE IN WRITING AND ACCOMPANIED BY A DEPOSIT OF THE EQUIVALENT OF 150 SFR. (£60) Articles 167-171, or £100 under British Showjumping Rule 198.
- 17. The Committee reserves to themselves the right to cancel or add to any of the competitions, or amend the conditions of any competition, dividing classes into sections, or cancelling sections, and amending prize money. Also, to hold any competition in the morning or on any such occasions, or at any such place as they may deem necessary (applicable only to National classes).
- 18. Entries for all National Classes confined to registered horses/ponies to be ridden by members in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.

19. RESPONSIBILITY

Neither the RIHS nor the Committee will be responsible for any accident, injury or damage that may occur to, or any illness or disease which may be contracted by, any animal entered at the Show howsoever occurring, and Exhibitors shall keep the RIHS and the Committee and each of them harmless and indemnified against all liability whatever, arising from any such accident, injury, damage, illness or disease. Neither the RIHS nor the Committee nor any of its or their officers, servants or agents shall be in any way liable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to Exhibitors or Competitors or their Servants or Agents, or to any animal or article exhibited, or to any property brought into the Show or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatever in connection with, or arising out of attributable to the Show or the RIHS or the Committee or any of them or their Officers, Servants or Agents or these or any other Rules and Regulations or Special Conditions prescribed by the RIHS.

Each Exhibitor will be considered responsible in all respects for the attendants in charge of his animals and for any other servants or agents of his and for the consequences of any infringements by any such persons of the Rules and Regulations.

20. DECISIONS

The decisions of the Committee or the Veterinary Surgeons or of any Judges or Show Officials upon any of the matters required by the foregoing Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting of any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objection shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie therefrom on any ground whatever (applicable only to National classes).

21. COMMITTEE'S POWERS

Subject as hereinafter provided the Committee shall have the power (applicable only to National classes):

- (i) To interpret these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions applicable to the Classes and to appoint Stewards and Officials for the enforcement thereof and for the purposes of the Show generally and such persons shall have full power accordingly.
- (ii) (In addition to the provisions of Rule 17) to determine any matter, question or difference whatever arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show or to these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions and their decision shall be final and binding and no appeal shall lie therefrom, and shall also have the power in case of emergency or expediency to suspend or relax any Rule or Regulations for such period and to such extent and in such manner as they think fit.

Provided always that when a competition is held under National Rules such National Rules of an affiliated Society or Association as are appropriate to the type and class of competition shall apply and have effect throughout such competition until immediately after the announcement of the results thereof (article 114.3 of the FEI General Regulations).
